- Learn the characteristics of herbivores, carnivores, and omnivores, and how dinosaurs are classified into these groups
- Explore math concepts by studying the different sizes and measurements of dinosaurs
- Interact with real and replica fossils and learn how scientists use fossils to make dinosaur discoveries
